

YPI Final Showcase events in 2020/21

Our aim is to provide the best possible support to you so that your YPI Final Showcase can remain an exciting and impactful event this year, within current guidance and limitations. YPI Final Showcases can be progressed as closed events or online. Options will be discussed and agreed with your YPI Regional Facilitator during the programme development session and as your Final planning develops. The flow chart opposite provides some areas for consideration when planning your YPI Final Showcase and the examples below illustrate potential models.

Example 1

- A small scale internal YPI Final Showcase, with judges selected from within the school community, where young people can present their work on a stage, in a classroom setting or as a digital product. Your YPI Facilitator supports judges' deliberations.
- No or limited socially distanced audience depending on setting.
- SLT involved in introducing and/or compering the Final to demonstrate value and alignment with school priorities.

Example 2

- An online YPI Final Showcase where presentations are pre-recorded prior to the agreed Final time. This could mean recording a spoken presentation, or groups are tasked with producing a digital package.
- Judges could be internal or external, meeting in person or via video call.
- Judges watch the presentations, prior to the judging call or during it, and deliberate to decide the winner with your YPI Regional Facilitator.

Example 3

- A live online Final Showcase where students make their presentations via video call, or a live streamed 'in person' Grand Final, where external parties and your YPI Facilitator can view proceedings online.
- Judges can tune into a video call or view a live stream of the Final to make their assessments, and then come together after the Final with your YPI Facilitator to deliberate and decide on the winner.
- This represents a more traditional YPI Final Showcase event while working within current guidelines.
